Entry process

Entries must be submitted by a member of staff from the school or college in which they work, or by an external stakeholder and supported by a testimony from you and/or a member of the senior management team.

An entry can be for a teacher, headteacher, teaching assistant, whole school, a partnership of schools or an FE lecturer, or FE team.

The headteacher or principal (or in the case of a headteacher entry, the deputy

Deadline: Midnight on Friday 28th February 2020

Entry policies

- Schools can enter more than one nominee per category, but the entries must be unique; they can also enter other nominees in to other categories.
- An individual may only be entered into one category in any given awards year., unless, in the case of whole school or FE Team awards they are also members of a wider team being entered, where that person must not be the primary team contact.
- Previous Pearson National Teaching Awards winners cannot be entered for further Pearson National Teaching Awards.
- If the nominee will be retiring before the end of April 2020 they are not eligible to be entered for a Teaching Award.



Writing your entry

Selecting a category

We recommend that before choosing a category, you study the descriptors and eligibility in order to decide which category to select. Category criteria can be found [here](#).

Entry

When you have chosen the appropriate category, the next step is to gather and organise the evidence you will use to support your entry. The Teaching Awards judges will use this evidence to prepare a shortlist of candidates whose schools/colleges they will visit.

We recommend that you submit a succinct and comprehensive case for your entry of approximately 1000 words, (not including opening statement) considering the guide prompts provided on the entry form.

Follow the steps outlined below to help you to complete your entry form:

1. Familiarise yourself with the prompts on the entry form before you write your entry. The prompts are designed to help you in formulating your entry and to give guidance on the detail that panel members will be exploring to compile their shortlist of finalists, but we want you to tell us about your nominee in the way that best suits you.

2. We recommend that you provide evidence and examples to support your statements wherever possible. Gather your evidence from a range of sources. The judging panel looks for the views of pupils, parents, colleagues and others, so we encourage you to invite comment from a wide range of people. You can guide them by sharing the prompts.

3. When you have all your evidence, write your entry ensuring you have considered the guide prompts. Overall our judges want to read about the 'magic' of your nominee.

Completing the entry form

Please complete the form [online](#). If you can't complete the form in one sitting, choose to save and continue. This will email you a link to your form which you can then access from any computer, in order to continue / finish the form.

Once you have completed the online entry form, please click the 'submit' button at the bottom of the form ensuring all sections are completed. Any incomplete entries will not be shortlisted.
